What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	For <u>network providers</u> \$100 individual or \$300 family; for <u>out-</u> <u>of-network providers</u> \$10,200 individual or \$30,600 family.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible.</u>
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. <u>Preventive Care</u> and Wellness are covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .
